## lesson DISCUSSION

Here are some discussion topics and questions you can ask your youth to reinforce the Saving Goals lesson.

### Discussion:

- Talk to your youth about the importance of saving money for the future.
- Talk to your youth about a time when you saved some of the money that you earned and what you were saving for.
- Help them think of things they might want to save for. It could be summer camp, college, or their next business venture.
- If your youth has a savings account, encourage them to add to it. If they don't, take them to the bank to open one.
